

### Chesapeake Bay Stewardship Fund (CBSF) Goals & Priorities

**❖ Measurably Improve Water Quality by 2025 per Bay TMDL** 


- Reduce nitrogen loading (10 million lbs/yr)
- Reduce phosphorus loading (1 million lbs/yr)
- Reduce sediment loading (200 million lbs/yr)

### **❖** Restore and Protect Key Species and their Habitats

- Eastern brook trout (increase habitat integrity & connectivity)
- American black duck (increase wetland habitat & available food)
- River herring (restore access and use of high quality habitat)
- Eastern oyster (restore populations in Bay tributaries)

### Foster Engaged and Diverse Citizens & Stakeholders

- Enlist 25,000 volunteers through education, skill-building, restoration events, etc.
- Develop/Improve 1,000 conservation, watershed, or habitat management plans





# **CBSF Request for Proposals** ~ Annual Grant Cycle

### Small Watershed Grants (SWG) ~ two types

### 1 - Implementation Grants (SWG-I)

- \$20,000 \$500,000
- 1/3 of grant request (non-federal match)
- 2-year grant period
- Eligible Applicants: 501(c) organizations, local/muni gov, Indian tribes, K-12 educational institutions

### 2 - Planning & Technical Assistance Grants (SWG-PTA)

- Up to \$50,000
- No match requirement
- 1-year grant period
- Eligible Applicants: 501(c) organizations, state gov agencies, local/muni gov, Indian tribes, K-12 educational institutions, forprofit entities





# **CBSF Request for Proposals** ~ Annual Grant Cycle

# **Innovative Nutrient & Sediment Reduction (INSR) Grants**

- \$500,000 **-** \$1,000,000
- 1:1 non-federal match
- 2 3 year grant period
- "Innovation" refers to regional collaboration and partnerships that demonstrate authentic partner involvement across strategic landscapes
- Eligible Applicants: 501(c) organizations, state gov agencies, local/muni gov, Indian tribes, educational institutions

# PA Local Government Implementation (PALGI) Grants

- Geography Tier 1 and Tier 2 WIP Phase 3 counties
- Target nutrient and sediment load reductions
- Eligible Applicants local governments and entities authorized by local governments
- Up to \$200,000
- Optional Match
- 2-year grant period

### Central Appalachia Habitat Stewardship Program (CAHSP)

### **Program Priorities**

### **Improve Forest Health**

- Create 90,000 acres of mixed-age classes
   (6 forest blocks, 5,000 25,000 acres each)
  - Golden-winged Warbler (275 breeding territories)
  - Wood Thrush (1,200 breeding territories)
  - Cerulean Warbler (2,700 breeding territories)


### **Improve Aquatic Habitat**

- Hydrology, water quality, connectivity BMPs
  - Eastern Brook Trout (increase effective breeders and size of patches)
  - Eastern Hellbender (increase occupancy and nesting success)
  - Freshwater Mussels (increase abundance and diversity)












# Central Appalachia Habitat Stewardship Program Request for Proposal (RFP)

RFP announcement ~ April 2021 Proposals Due ~ June 2021 Awards Announced ~ November 2021

- \$50,000 \$200,000
- 1:1 non-federal match encouraged
- 2 3 year grant period
- Eligible Applicants: 501(c) orgs, state/local/municipal gov, Indian tribes, educational institutions



## **Building a Strong Proposal:**

- Project goals well-align with NFWF Program Goals
  - Ensure outcomes align with specific grant program priorities
  - ☐ Employ **Priority Practices** (e.g., buffers, soil health, GSI, etc. )
  - ☐ Is project located in a **Target Water Quality Geography or Habitat**
  - ☐ Include all relevant **measurable priority outcomes** or outcomes

#### Strong Co-Benefits

- Non-water quality outcomes (e.g., flooding, habitat improvements)
- Community/landowner conservation education and awareness

#### Stakeholder Engagement

- ☐ Enlist key stakeholders and diverse partners
- ☐ Letters of support
- Include partner roles in your work plan and budget
